

Religious Exemption against COVID Vaccination Affidavit

To Whom it May Concern:

Pursuant to the Bible standard set in I Corinthians 6:19 as well as the principles of the Law of God in Torah and as outlined by Jewish Halakha, the Assembly of Called-Out Believers and all its members and followers around the world are unable to comply with COVID vaccination on religious and moral grounds and claim our sovereign right under God to exercise our religious exemption.

Regarding Vaccination Religious Exemption:

We at the Assembly of Called-Out Believers believe our bodies to be a temple for the indwelling Spirit of God and thus choose 1) to put our trust in God for our protection and healing and have 2) we cannot partake in anything produced or tested using cell lines made from aborted fetuses. Furthermore, the Covid vaccines have not been fully tested, and have been only released on Emergency Use Authorization. The Medical profession has made mistakes in the past that have caused great harm to people and so we choose to exercise our sovereign right under God to protect our bodies and not tamper with the Divine image encoded in our DNA.

Note: Our Constitutional Rights

Going back to the first amendment, the very first freedom is the freedom of speech and the freedom of the religious exercise. As sovereign free moral agents under God we choose to exercise these rights.

Reference to past Precedence set in Congress:

"Indeed, the consensus of the witnesses appearing before the congressional committees was that individual belief -- rather than membership in a church or sect -- determined the duties that God imposed upon a person in his everyday conduct, and that "there is a higher loyalty than loyalty to this country, loyalty to God." (United State Supreme Court, Justice Clark, delivering the opinion of the court in United States vs. Seeger, 380 US 163 - 1965)
